

# 52 DAYS OF PRAYER & WORSHIP



## DAY 29 – WE ARE THE DWELLING PLACE FOR THE LORD

**THE WORD** Hebrews 8:10; 2 Corinthians 6:16; 1 Peter 2:9

### GLOBAL PRAYER POINT

Pray that the Body of Christ would return to holiness and intimacy, becoming a pure dwelling place where the Lord is pleased to abide.

### LIVING OUT THE WORD

Set aside intentional time today to minister to the Lord in worship, prioritizing His presence over activity.

## DEVOTIONAL FOCUS

The Lord desires a dwelling place—not built by human hands, but formed within the hearts of His covenant people. Under the new covenant, He writes His laws upon our hearts and makes us His sanctuary. We are called to be a holy temple where He dwells and walks among His people.

Ezekiel's vision of the temple reveals inner-court ministry to the Lord and outer-court ministry to people. The faithful priests, like the sons of Zadok, were permitted to draw near and minister to Him because they remained loyal when others strayed. The warning is clear: activity in ministry cannot replace intimacy with God.

The Lord seeks hearts marked by holiness, humility, and covenant faithfulness. Ministry must flow from communion. He desires our hearts more than our works.

## Day 29 - We are the Dwelling Place for The Lord

This is a teaching I have taught many times as I travel. This is the heart of God, and He refreshed me this morning by speaking it back into my life. Now He wants it to go to our partners. Please be a dwelling place for Him so you can come close to Him and minister to Him ALONE.

Ezekiel's vision of the future temple refers to the restoration of purity and spiritual vitality to the ideal place of worship and to those who will worship there. It is not intended to be an earthly, physical fulfillment, but a place within the hearts of the Lord's people. THE LORD IS THERE.

GOD WILL DWELL IN THE NEW TEMPLE AND AMONG HIS PEOPLE.

**Hebrews 8:10** "For this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the Lord. I will put My laws in their mind and write them on their hearts; and I will be their God, and they shall be My people."

For this to happen, we must separate ourselves from the world and from our flesh to enter such a love affair.

**2 Corinthians 6:16** "...For you are the temple of the living God; as God has said: I will dwell in them and walk among them, I will be their God, and they shall be My people."

We must know that we are a temple, a dwelling place prepared for Him. Our heart is to be His sanctuary. But for this, there must be a continual communion. We must separate ourselves so as not touch what is unclean. We must allow God and discipline ourselves to cleanse ourselves from ALL FILTHINESS OF THE FLESH AND SPIRIT, PERFECTING HOLINESS IN THE FEAR OF GOD.

**Ezekiel 37:26-27** "Moreover, I will make a covenant of peace with them, and it shall be an everlasting covenant with them; I will establish them and multiply them, and I will set My sanctuary in their midst forevermore. My tabernacle also shall be with them; indeed, I will be their God, and they shall be My people."

We are in covenant with Him for His sanctuary. As we build the wall of Prayer, we will see that the temple is being built.

Please read **Revelation 21:1-22**.

This is a description of our future dwelling place. Jesus is the tabernacle, and He will dwell with us and among us. Before that day, we can enter His heart, the temple.

To understand this temple, Ezekiel gave us a description of a vision the Lord gave him: the temple was not built with the hands of man, but by God's sacrifice. This sacrifice was Him sending His only Son to be the propitiation for our sins.

And by sending His Son, He set up a new covenant and a new order that made all believers priests unto Him.

**1 Peter 2:9** “but you are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, His own special people, that you may proclaim the praises of Him who called you out of darkness into His marvelous light.”

**Ezekiel 43:19** “... the Levites, who are the seed of Zadok, who approach Me to minister to Me...”

We also see in **Deuteronomy 10:8** that Levi was set apart to Minister to God.

Zadok, the chief priest under David, was a descendant of Aaron.

In **Ezekiel 44:7-14**, the temple is to be administered only by covenant priests.

God showed Ezekiel how He wanted His temple to be administered. He said He wanted the chamber facing north to be for the priests who have charge of the altar. These are the sons of Zadok, from the sons of Levi, who come near the Lord to minister to Him. The sons of Zadok were the remnant of priests who remained faithful to God when others strayed away from Him.

**1 Kings 1:8** These priests were commended for their faithfulness, and they are distinguished from the Levites who went astray. Because of their faithfulness, they were elevated and participated in offering the fat and the blood, sacrifices dear to the Lord. They were the only ones allowed to enter His sanctuary and come near to God’s table to minister to Him and to keep His charge (to hear from Him and do what He asked).

**Ezekiel 44:5** “And the Lord said to me, mark well, see with your eyes and hear with your ears, all that I say to you concerning all the ordinances of the house of the Lord and all its laws. Mark well all who may enter the house and all who go out from the sanctuary.”

This is the same as the warning to the Church in Revelation: “Those who have an ear, let them hear what the Spirit is saying.” The Lord is sending out great warnings to the Church in this hour, and we must take heed to them.

God is a covenant-keeping God, and when He saw that His people brought a mixture into His temple, He was not pleased.

**Ezekiel 44:7** “When you brought in foreigners, uncircumcised in heart and in flesh, to be in My sanctuary to profane it; and offered My food and fat and blood, then they broke My covenant because of all your abominations.”

This is what we are doing today in our Churches. We are bringing foreign worship and the activities of the world into His temple. Our hearts are not cleansed of the sins and hurts of our past, causing us to stray. This has made the Lord very angry, seeing that we have not kept His covenant, and to make matters worse, we have brought abominations into His sanctuary. We have not kept charge of His holy things, but have set foreigners

to keep charge of His sanctuary. “No foreigner uncircumcised in heart or flesh shall enter My sanctuary!”

There are many who minister in the Body of Christ, doing the works of the ministry, yet do not have an intimate relationship with Holy God. They do not get to see Him face-to-face as a friend. They only do the works, which alone are not pleasing to Him. The Lord loves us and wants a close, intimate relationship with each one of us.

**Mathew 7:21-23** “Many will say to Me in that day, ' Lord, Lord, have we not prophesied in Your name, cast out demons in Your name, and done many wonders in Your name? And then I will declare to them, I never knew you, depart from Me, you who practice lawlessness.”

The word knew means to be intimate and close to Him. We must be careful not to think we are doing good by spending our time working for Him. He desires for us to spend time with Him daily, ministering to Him and His heart's desires. This is a warning: we must be careful not to confuse working in the ministry with our time in His presence. He wants our HEART.

The Lord set a standard for His people and separated those who stayed faithful and those who are in the ministry that was not faithful. Please read **Ezekiel 44:10-16**

The Levites who went far from God when Israel went astray after their idols, bore the punishment for their iniquity. He let the unfaithful priests remain as priests, but they were not allowed to minister to God in His sanctuary; they were to minister to the people. They ministered in His tabernacle by having oversight of gates, slaughtering the burnt offerings, and ministering to the people. But they were not to come near to the Lord to be a priest to Him. They were to bear the shame of the abominations which they had committed.

The faithful priests were the ones the Lord chose to come close to Him and to minister to Him in the sanctuary.

This is to be our ultimate priority in Worship: leading people to and through revival as we worship God in the innermost sanctuary of His presence. All ministries must become the natural outflow of an intimate relationship with our Loving Heavenly Father.

Simply stated, Ezekiel sees the temple as an inner court ministry to God and an outer court ministry to the people. The priests who neglected the inner court were called an abomination to God. The faithful priests who ministered to the Lord with worship and adoration in the inner court received God's enablement to minister to the needs of the people in the outer court.

**Romans 12:1** I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that you present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God, which is your reasonable service.”

## Prayer Focus

- That the entire body of Christ will be covered with humility and holiness in their heart, to know Him in Love and obedience.
- That we take the Nazarite Vow (Numbers 6, Judges 13, **Ezekiel 44:20-23**) and live a lifestyle of holiness so we can know Him and his holiness.
- That we will teach God's people the difference between the holy and the unholy and cause them to discern between the unclean and the clean, to know Him in truth and wisdom
- That we will judge Your people in righteousness, to know your heart that will bring justice through our prayers.
- That we will keep the Word in all Righteousness, that we know the Word
- That we will stay away from that which is dead, so that we know Him in Purity and Separation. That we will remember Him as our inheritance, that we know Him in Faithfulness.
- That we will know that our faithfulness brings His blessing, we must know Him for His Provision.

# 52 DAYS OF PRAYER & WORSHIP



## DAY 30 – PRACTICING THE LOVE OF GOD

**THE WORD** Nehemiah 4:17; Zechariah 3:1–2; 1 John 4:7–11

### GLOBAL PRAYER POINT

Pray for grace to respond to accusation and opposition with the love of God rather than offense or retaliation.

### LIVING OUT THE WORD

Choose to love intentionally today—especially toward someone who has misunderstood or hurt you.

### DEVOTIONAL FOCUS

As we build the wall of prayer, we must practice the presence and love of God. Nehemiah's builders worked with one hand and held a weapon with the other—prayer and fasting operate together in this hour. The accuser stands ready to oppose those who draw near to God. Yet the Lord rebukes the adversary and clothes His people with clean garments. When accusations arise, we give ourselves to prayer rather than retaliation.

Practicing love requires discipline. It means responding with God's nature rather than reacting in the flesh. As we remain in His presence, His love fills us and overcomes bitterness, hurt, and division.

## Day 30 - Practicing the Love of God

Prayer Partners of the Nations:

As we continue to build the wall of prayer, we must practice the presence of God in this hour so we can hear His voice, not the enemy's.

Please don't come off the wall; stay there and remain in His presence.

We are seeing God move like never before!

**Nehemiah 4:17** gives us a great example.

Those who built the wall, and those who carried burdens, loaded themselves so that with one hand they worked at the construction, and with the other held a weapon.

We are called to carry the load by praying and worshipping every day, and then to battle with our weapons in our hands through fasting.

I have seen the power of this twofold mandate in this season of hearing God's voice.

Thank you for fasting and praying for the Kingdom.

The word practicing means to carry out, to exercise, to be disciplined.

**Psalm 109:4** "In return for my love, they are my accusers, but I give myself to prayer."

David knew He was chosen by God, yet the enemy kept coming against him, so He stayed focused on prayer. This is practicing the presence of God, and it is what He has asked us to do in this season of prayer.

"In return for my love ..." When we have been chosen by the Lord, we must understand that many accusers will come in our time of being in His presence. When our accusers come, we must give ourselves to prayer! The Lord knows that when we make this great commitment to follow Him, the accuser comes, which is why the Lord is encouraging us to pray.

Please read **Job 1:6-7**

This passage speaks of satan, our adversary, who is also called the accuser. He walks to and fro over the earth, looking to accuse God's people. He looks for those he can devour that are righteous before the Lord. The adversary, the accuser, hates those who love God. When we give out the love of God, the hater comes to accuse us. When he sees your love for God, he hates you even more.

The Hebrew word for satan is sah-than, which means opponent, the hater; the accuser; adversary, enemy; one who resists, obstructs, and hinders whatever is good, one who withstands. All these describe his nature. We must understand his nature. If we don't

have understanding in this hour, we will be deceived and unable to deal with our opponent. Our opponent will keep us from the presence of God because he hates seeing us get closer to God. Especially those who make the commitment to come into the presence of God and serve Him.

**Zechariah 3:1** “Then he showed me Joshua the high priest standing before the Angel of the Lord, and satan standing at His right hand to oppose him.”

The Lord shows us how the accuser lurks to oppose us. Oppose means to disapprove, argue against, attempt to prevent, actively resist, and refuse.

The accuser is actively standing before the Lord, finding fault with us, arguing against us, and preventing us from coming to the Lord. Joshua is a priest, a child of God, and satan is finding accusations against him. Can you hear his arguments against us, reminding God what we have done in our past? How can we have not been faithful, and how can Jesus accept us when we still have things in our hearts?

**Zechariah 3:2** “The Lord said to satan, the Lord rebuke you, satan! The Lord who has chosen Jerusalem rebuke you! Is this not the brand plucked from the fire?”

The Lord stands up against the enemy on our behalf, because he has plans for us. A brand is an identifying mark burned into something or someone that belongs to its master or owner.

The Lord is saying, "This one is mine; you cannot touch him, because My name is branded on them."

Oh, hear the Lord as He rebukes satan. He is saying this is my child, the one I marked before they were born; I branded this one. I pulled them out of the fire of your hands, and now they are in My Hands. MY NAME IS BRANDED ON THEM. We all should be shouting and praising the Lord!

**Zechariah 3:3** “Now Joshua was clothed with filthy garments and was standing before the Angel.”

Then the Lord spoke to the angel who stood before Him and asked him to remove the filthy garments from Joshua, removing his iniquity. Then the Love of God begins to clothe him in rich robes from the throne room and puts a clean turban on his head. The Lord cleanses us and changes the way we think, renewing our minds.

Jesus comes to fight for us when the accuser comes. He cleans us up and changes our hearts completely. He stands for us because of His love. We do not have to worry about the battle; we just must understand His love and walk in it as He stands against our adversary.

When we practice staying in His presence and receive His love, we are then filled with His love, which we are to give out to others. It is not easy on this journey to love, because when we give out His love to others, we must understand it will not always be

received. Even when Jesus gave His love out, His accusers came against Him. We are following Him in this love. We are practicing His love as we stay in His presence, so we can walk as He walked.

**1 John 3:10** “In this the children of God and the children of the devil are manifest; Whoever does not practice righteousness is not of God, nor is he who does not love his brother”.

God is love; He is the opposite of satan, which is hate. We are opposed to the enemy because our nature is now love. Now our hearts are filled with the Love of God, and we cannot hate like satan’s nature, because our nature is of the Holy Spirit that stays in the presence of God.

**1 John 3:14** “We know that we have passed from death (the hands of the enemy) to life because we love the brethren. He who does not love his brother still abides in death.”

The Love of God causes us to lay down our lives for Him and each other.

**1 John 4:7-11** “Beloved, let us love one another for love is of God; and everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. He who does not love does not know God, for God is love. In this, the love of God was manifested toward us, that God has sent His only begotten Son into the world, that we might live through Him.”

“Beloved, if God so loved us, we also ought to love one another.”

We must prepare our hearts to understand that the discipline of being in the Presence of God is glorious, but we will face our accusers. The enemy hates us so much that he does not want to see love in the child of God. The accuser will use those who are the closest to you to come against you. You must pray for the nature of God, not for satan to be your reaction to any attacks.

### Prayer Focus

- God help me see that those whom I love have become my accusers, because they do not know Your Love. Give me patience and fill me with Your love.
- Teach me, Lord, how to love those who are still angry and still have hurt and hate in them. I understand that hurting people hurt people, but it is still hard for me to show love to those who hurt me.
- God help me to see the enemy, not my brother, when he comes up against me.
- God help me when I let the enemy’s voices remind me of my sins and past failings, which keep me from my future. I am like Joshua in Zechariah. I know You are cleaning me up. Give me endurance to wait on you to complete what You have started in me.
- God, help me go to the lost and see Your unconditional love for them, even when they do not know why they hate You or who You are.
- God help me to stay in Your presence so I can follow You in this love.

## DAY 31 – GATHERING AND UNITING OF GOD’S NEW BRIDE WARRIOR

**THE WORD** Song of Solomon 6:1–3; Joshua 5:13–15; 1 Chronicles 12:18

### GLOBAL PRAYER POINT

Pray for unity, loyalty, and spiritual discipline within the Body of Christ as God gathers His army.

### LIVING OUT THE WORD ✓

Examine your heart for covenant faithfulness and recommit to serving the Lord with loyalty and humility.

## DEVOTIONAL FOCUS

The Lord is gathering a Bride who is also a warrior—intimate in devotion and disciplined in battle. Covenant relationship precedes conquest. The Bride must dwell in His chambers before advancing in warfare.

Like David’s mighty men, those whom the Spirit clothes will come in loyalty and peace, ready to serve the King with one heart and one mind. Rank, order, and spiritual authority must be understood and honored within God’s army.

Covenant loyalty is essential. We are called to serve with a willing mind and a faithful heart, knowing that the Lord searches our intentions and rewards faithfulness.

## Day 31 - Gathering and Uniting of God's New Bride Warrior

This is the cry of Jesus for the heart of His people to position ourselves in Covenant as a New Bride Warrior. We must follow His heart as a Bride to be intimate with Him daily. Every day is an opportunity to win souls. The Love of the Father will be declared before His children. Jesus is calling us to battle, but He waits for us to come closer to Him to hear His heart and His trumpet sounds. The Bride should be in His chambers, and He is waiting. He has searched for her in the garden, as He comes to gather His beloved.

Please read Song of **Solomon 6:1-3**

A Bride is a woman about to be married. He refers to us, the Body of Christ, as one with whom He is making a covenant. He is binding His heart to us to fulfill His purpose on the earth, all for His Glory.

A Warrior is a person engaged and experienced in warfare; someone called as a soldier to conquer territory.

We must position ourselves to enter a covenant to lead others into the Kingdom of God. We are the new bride warrior that has been chosen to conquer territory and see souls come into the kingdom

**Revelation 19:11** "And I saw heaven opened; and behold a white horse, and He who sat upon it is called Faithful and True, and in righteousness He judges and wages war.

Jesus is returning not just to wage war, but to win a victory for His people. We are in a season where there is no peace. This is a time of preparing our hearts to fully return to Him. He is positioning and preparing us for battle, for the fight for the lives, for those who will be affected by this season of darkness and conflict.

We can see, as in the times of David, that Jesus is conquering and gathering. God is gathering His People in this hour.

Ally means to place in a friendly association or to unite or connect in a personal relationship, as in friendship or marriage. Another definition is a state of formal cooperation for military purposes. That word means to unite and connect personally and to cooperate for the military or armed forces.

Gathering means to bring together into one group or place, to assemble from various places, sources or people.

This is a Word from the Lord, the Commander of the Army, **Joshua 5:13-1**:

I am raising up an army and am calling this ministry to mobilize My people. Now I am bringing them to this ministry to raise them up. Mighty men and women, helpers in the war, armed with bows. These are men and women who have been equipped, but their

weapons were misplaced, or they are wounded and hurt from previous wars. Now gather them unto Me. I will lead them to conquer and to have victory.

**Joshua 5:15** “Then the Commander of the Lord’s army said to Joshua, take your sandal off your foot, for the place where you stand is holy. And Joshua did so.”

When we are with the Commander of the Army, the Lord of Hosts, we are on Holy ground. We must have a position of understanding that He is in charge, as we come to Him in humility and respect seeking His Wisdom.

God is gathering Mighty Men and Women of God by the Spirit of the Lord our God, who are coming to bring us help.

Please read **1 Chronicles 12:18-22** and pray it personally as a member of this great army of God.

We are yours, O Jesus; We are on your side, O Son of God. Peace, peace to you and peace to your helpers, for Our Father helps Us. This is our loyalty to You, Jesus. Thank you for calling us to partner with you in this Great Army.

This needs to be the cry of our hearts to the Lord:

Spirit of the Lord, come upon us in this Gathering to ally with the troops that will be loyal to Jesus alone, and unite us to accomplish what You have called us all to do. We all come to make Jesus King over us with one mind and with one heart to be loyal to Him alone.

Covenant is the key in this time of Conquering. This requires a covenant with Jesus that leads us to say, "We come to this place to give Jesus a loyal heart." We desire to have the same mind as our Lord, to bring the gospel to all who do not know Him. This will require commitment and covenant to finish the work. We must let the Spirit of the Lord clothe us to speak the Heart of the Father through our hearts, which are united with our King Jesus.

We see in **1 Chronicles 12:18** that “the Spirit came upon Amasai” to come to David and ally himself with him. In the Old Testament, when you see the Spirit coming upon someone, it is also translated as the Spirit clothed Himself with that person. The Spirit clothed Himself with Amasai, which means He took possession of Amasai, and directed his steps to come and help David.

Just as David received the mighty men of valor in peace, we must come in peace and rest so we can be a help and be united with one heart.

Read 1 Chronicles 12: 33-38

This passage of Scripture speaks to us of the importance of discipline and training in battle. We must know how to keep rank, how to gather in battle and stay in battle formation, and become skilled with the weapons of our warfare.

Rank is an assigned position, official place, or standing in the military.

God has placed authority over mankind in our whole lives. Mature Christians must understand spiritual authority! Please read **Romans 13:1-5**

All authority is given to us and set in place by God. If we resist authority, we bring judgment on ourselves.

The Lord is gathering His people, and we must just stay faithful to what He has called us to as a ministry. Many will defect and leave the ministry, but many will remain faithful out of their trust in Him. God will show us through discernment who is with us and who will be against us, because He is with us!

**1 Chronicles 28:9-10** "...Know the God of your father and serve Him with a loyal heart and with a willing mind; for the Lord searches all hearts and understands all the intents of the thoughts. If you seek Him, He will be found by you; but if you forsake Him, He will cast you off forever. Consider now, for the Lord has chosen you to build a house for the sanctuary; be strong and do it!"

We must serve God with all our hearts!

#### Prayer Focus

- We must pray that we will have a loyal heart and a willing mind.
- We must pray that we will be faithful to seek Him.
- We must pray that we will not forsake Him in the hard times.
- We must pray that we will know that the Lord has chosen us to build a sanctuary for Him.
- We must pray that we will have the strength to finish building the wall of prayer.
- We must pray that we will understand His plans and strategies.

## DAY 32 – EXHORTATIONS AND ENCOURAGEMENTS TO STRENGTHEN

**THE WORD** 1 Thessalonians 5:5–8, 16–19

### GLOBAL PRAYER POINT

Pray for spiritual alertness, unity, and perseverance within the Church.

### LIVING OUT THE WORD

Encourage someone in leadership today and recommit to consistent, disciplined prayer.

### DEVOTIONAL FOCUS

We are children of the light and must remain watchful and sober. The Day of the Lord approaches, and we must discern the times. The call is clear: rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all things, and do not quench the Spirit.

Leaders must be esteemed, unity must be guarded, and encouragement must flow freely among believers. Division, pride, busyness, and compromise weaken revival fires.

The Lord strengthens His people through exhortation and discipline. We are called to vigilance, gratitude, and sustained prayer in this dark hour.

## Day 32 - Exhortations and Encouragements to Strengthen

Please read **1Thessalonians 5:1-11**

We need these scriptures to make it through the fast, as the Lord prepares us on this journey. He is giving us direction and encouragement throughout this chapter. We have been called to be a 24/7 Prayer Tower for our city, nation, and world. We must continue the journey with Him. The prayers must continue with intensity as we build the House of God.

**1Thessalonians 5:1** “But concerning the times and the seasons, brethren, you have no need that I should write to you.”

First, the Lord warns us that the Day of the Lord is at hand. We must discern the times in which we live. This is a warning; do we not see deep darkness all around us? It will affect every one of us in one way or another. Jesus will return, and He will come like a thief in the night.

Second, we must be Watchful as He gives us a warning of His return.

**1Thessalonians 5:5-6** “You are all sons of the light and sons of the day. We are not of the night or of darkness, therefore let us not sleep, as other do, but let us watch and be sober” (serious, alert, aware).

Third, we must be awakened; we cannot close our eyes to what is happening around us. We must put on our battle clothes and pray for salvation for lost souls.

**1Thessalonians 5: 9-10** “For God did not appoint us to wrath (His anger, judgment), but to obtain salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ, who died for us, that whether we wake or sleep, we should live together with Him.”

The Lord wants our eyes to be open to the harvest and to His heart for them. Jesus has given us instructions and His battle plans for His people. It is time for us to carry them out. He did not choose us for His anger and judgment that He has stored up for our enemies, but we were chosen for Greatness and Goodness to carry God's Glory. He is returning, and He desires us to live together with Him for eternity.

There is such passion and love for us in His heart as He warns us to be Watchful and to wake up to what He is about to do in this HOUR. Are you Awakened?

The Lord knows this end-time battle will not be easy, and the first to go under great attack will be the leaders.

Please read the Encouragements and Exhortations in **1 Thessalonians 5:12-14**

He encourages us to esteem (respect and admire) those who are laboring in the ministry and those who are over (leading) you. To admonish (instruct and warn) those who are

on the battlefield with you daily. There are days when the leaders and warriors are worn out from the great battle. Please keep each other encouraged.

We must esteem them with love for all they do and keep peace among each other. Fight and pursue the peace that will keep unity in the body of Christ. Ephesians 4 speaks so well on this subject as God establishes the leaders of the Church.

We must exhort (strongly encourage or urge someone) our brethren and warn those who are unruly (insubordinate - defiant to authority/disobedient, or idle-not working, active, or being useful). We must bring a strong warning to them and let God deal with their hearts.

We must encourage one another by bringing comfort to those who are fainthearted (lack courage), uphold the weak, take care of those who are sick, orphans, widows, all of those who cannot help themselves.

Most of all, we must encourage everyone on the battlefield to be patient with one another.

Please read **1Thessalonians 5: 15-28**

These scriptures speak very clearly about our responsibility as warriors on the Battlefield in this season.

**1Thessalonians 5: 15** "See that no one renders (submit, give over) evil for evil to anyone, but always pursue what is good both for yourselves and for all."

**1Thessalonians 5: 16** "Rejoice always."

No matter how hard it gets, we must have joy.

**1Thessalonians 5: 17** "Pray without ceasing."

Pray for 24/7, twenty-four hours a day and seven days a week. Don't stop praying in this season; it is so important. Times are dark, and the devil is on the run. Please don't stop praying.

**1Thessalonians 5: 18** "In everything give thanks; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you."

Worship, Worship, Worship! We must praise and worship Him so much more, in this time, so we can see the Glory of His coming with thanksgiving in our hearts.

**1Thessalonians 5: 19** "Do not quench the Spirit."

Do not put out (extinguish or cool off) the FIRE OF THE HOLY SPIRIT.

God has given us the Fire, and we must guard against the dwindling of it. Revival fires wane for various reasons.

## Prayer Focus

- Pray, we must not compromise. We must not allow the excitement of crowds and miracles to dull our ears to hearing the truth of the Holy Spirit. He is leading us God's way, and not by our own agendas.
- Pray, we must not have Religious Ways. This is when we stop allowing the Holy Spirit to move in His way, and we try to control things with our own ideas or religious backgrounds.
- Pray we must not bring Division. When we fear man, or when man does not understand the heart of the Leader that God is speaking to in that season, division and discord come in their midst, because of fear.
- Pray we must not have Pride. What is our attitude toward what God is doing in our midst? We must not use Him for our own good to be famous and rich, but to glorify Him in all regards.
- Pray that we do not neglect to make disciples. They are needed so the effectiveness of revival can be multiplied.
- Pray we do not allow Breakdown of authority and unity in the leadership team through prayerlessness, weariness, or functioning outside the boundaries of an individual's giftings.
- Pray we do not have Busyness. This is when we allow busyness and the excitement of revival to take priority over vigilance in humble prayer and intercession
- Please study today's scriptures, as you can see, there is so much we can TEACH from HIS directions and instructions.
- We must discern the time and season that we are living in NOW.

## DAY 33 – PREPARING TO WALK IN POWER, STANDING FOR UNITY

**THE WORD** 1 Samuel 17:45–47

### GLOBAL PRAYER POINT

Pray for courage to stand against spiritual defilement in families, churches, and nations.

### LIVING OUT THE WORD

Identify an area where fear has silenced you and choose to stand in faith today.

### DEVOTIONAL FOCUS

“Is there not a cause?” David’s question echoes through every generation. God seeks those willing to stand when others retreat in fear. The enemy defiles through division, discouragement, and darkness, but faith stands firm in the name of the Lord of Hosts. David’s victory was not through borrowed armor but through faith refined in trials. God chooses living stones—willing vessels—to confront giants and restore honor to His name. Standing requires courage, unity, and confidence in the Lord’s battle plan. The battle belongs to the Lord, but we must take our place in obedience.

## Day 33 - Preparing to Walk in Power, Standing for Unity

**1 Samuel 17:29** "And David said, 'What have I done now? Is there not a cause?'"

The Lord gave this to us before, and it is worth repeating. We see David chosen to make a stand before Goliath, and he sees the purposes and the heart of God. We are chosen, and we must be prepared. As we read a story that has been taught to us since our youth, we must gain fresh understanding and guidance. David was willing to STAND and fight the champion of the enemy, but the brethren did not receive his walk of faith.

Is there not a cause? The word cause means a person or thing that acts or exists in such a way that some specific thing happens as a result; a reason or motive for some action; good reason for movement to which a person or group is dedicated; a person that gives rise to an action; reasonable grounds for tacking action; movement that cause a deep commitment for one who is prepared to defend.

When we gather with a common cause, we are united in the joint effort and work together until the end.

So David had to ask those who walked in fear the question we should ask ourselves when fear takes over our hearts. God is looking for us to STAND up against the enemy that is defiling our families, churches, communities, and nations, as we walk into his territory

There are *seven Ds of defilement* from the devil: *division/discord, drugs, depression, distress, deep debt, and deep darkness*. We must bring them down, and we must be driven with faith to STAND up. We must not let people around us who walk in fear dictate what we need to do. If we do, we will be stopped from what we have been chosen to do for the Lord.

IS THERE NOT A CAUSE?

Discouragement can come from the very ones who are supposed to be with us, the brethren of the army.

**1 Samuel 17:33** "Saul said to David, 'You are not able to go against this Philistine to fight with him; for you are a youth, and he is a man of war from his youth'."

Thank God that David had a testimony of fighting impossible foes, having been trained by the Lord of Hosts.

You have been chosen to STAND and be trained by the Lord of Hosts and not man. It is important not to falter between two opinions. We cannot live a double life before God. In 1 Kings 18, God told Elijah to take 12 stones and build an altar. He made a STAND, and he said before the people, "The Lord is God." He is God alone! We cannot trust in ourselves and others, only in the Lord!

We must STAND and continue the work at what the Lord has chosen for us to do, and that is to fight day and night until we finish the work; building and encouraging 24/7 prayer meetings around the world until He returns. Even when our enemies come to put fear in us and mock us, we must continue to STAND in the gap for the House of Prayer. As we build the wall of prayer, we will be using living stones, which are His precious stones (God's people).

When we begin to think we are too small, too insignificant, too young, too old... we must see the faith of a young heart, who trusted God because of His faithfulness in his trials, which equipped him to stand and fight in this battle God chose and prepared for him. **1 Samuel 17:34-37**

IS THERE NOT A CAUSE?

We must STAND and go into battle against the enemy. We must bring with us the weapons God has chosen for us in this battle, not the weapons and testimonies of others. The Lord of Hosts is preparing us with power.

David's testimony was, I killed both lion and bear; and this uncircumcised Philistine will be one of them, seeing he has defiled the armies of the LIVING God.

How long will we allow the defilement of the devil to mock God's people? The Lord is the living God, and we are His living stones.

**1 Samuel 17:40** "Then he took his staff in his hand; and he chose for himself five smooth stones for the brook, and put them in a shepherd's bag, in a pouch which he had, and his sling was in his hand. And he drew near to the Philistine."

This is faith produced from testing and trials that equipped him for this big trial. Have you allowed your faith to grow during your testing and trials, or have you just endured them until they were over?

The Lord has chosen living stones to fight His battle. But not all will pay the price to be a sacrifice for the Lord. Out of 5 stones, David chose one smooth stone, just as he and his tribe were selected out of the 12 tribes to rule over the land. God chose David as one of those living stones from His heart to fight against the enemy. He wants us to see the power of the ONE that God chooses. I hope you see what God is speaking.

1 Samuel 17: 45-46 "Then David said to the Philistine, you come to me with a sword, with a spear, and with a javelin, but I come to you in the name of the Lord of hosts, the God of the armies of Israel, whom you have defied. This day the Lord will deliver you into my hand..., that all the earth may know that there is a God in Israel."

Does this not sound like what Elijah said before those false prophets?

IS THERE NOT A CAUSE?

David walked in faith and confidence. He was chosen to fight in oneness with the Lord of hosts. The Lord of hosts is Jesus and His warring angels in the spirit realm of the heavens.

**1 Samuel 17:47** “Then all this assembly shall know that the Lord does not save with sword and spear, for the battle is the Lord's, and He will give you into our hands.”

This is the heart of God for those who have a special task on the earth, to STAND and fight against the deep darkness of the world. We will not back off, because we are STANDING with the Lord of hosts. He will battle for us as we make this STAND.

Oh, please read the story, there is so much for us here in **1 Samuel 17**, but you know we must stay focused.

**1 Samuel 17:50** “So David prevailed over the Philistine with a sling and a STONE and struck the Philistine and killed him. But there was no sword in the hand of David.”

When God shows Himself great, He takes the battles that look impossible and then shows Himself great just as He did for Elijah, Nehemiah, and now David. They were chosen precious stones that God used for His glory.

We must see ourselves as precious living stones in the hands of God. We are very valuable to God. Man cannot see our value, but God does, and He loves finding a vessel that will willingly lay down their lives to deal with those 7 D's that look impossible to defeat. But we know that with God, all things are possible.

#### Prayer Focus

- We must hear the call to come and STAND IN THE GAP. Is there not a cause?
- We must let Him work His faith in our lives to see truth as we STAND! Is there not a cause?
- We must arise and STAND for what we believe in, even when it looks its worst! Is there not a cause?
- We must trust Him, and when we have done all, we know to do, we must STAND! Is there not a cause?
- We must stand and cry out to the Lord to deal with us as we stand against the seven Ds in our lives, families, churches, communities, and nations. Are we ready to take back what belongs to God and us? IS THERE NOT A CAUSE?

## DAY 34 – SPIRITUAL BLINDNESS

**THE WORD** John 9:3–5; Matthew 5:14–16; Isaiah 60:1–3

### GLOBAL PRAYER POINT

Pray that spiritual blindness would be removed from the Church and that believers would shine boldly in increasing darkness.

### LIVING OUT THE WORD

Ask the Lord to reveal any area of spiritual blindness and commit to walking in His light.

## DEVOTIONAL FOCUS

Every person is born spiritually blind until encountering Christ. Yet blindness must not remain. Jesus declared Himself the Light of the world, and now His light shines through those who belong to Him. Darkness increases, but we are called to arise and shine. Spiritual blindness often hides behind assumption, judgment, or complacency. The Lord opens eyes so that we may open the eyes of others. We must refuse to let our lamps grow dim. Holiness, obedience, and surrender keep the flame alive in a dark world.

## Day 34 - Spiritual Blindness

A Man Born Blind Receives Sight

**John 9:1-5** “Now as Jesus passed by, He saw a man who was blind from birth. And His disciples asked Him, saying, “Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?” Jesus answered, “Neither this man nor his parents sinned, but that the works of God should be revealed in him. I must work the works of Him who sent Me while it is day; the night is coming when no one can work. As long as I am in the world, I am the light of the world.”

“Now as Jesus passed by, He saw a man who was blind from birth.”

Every man’s spiritual condition is kept in the dark from birth until he encounters Jesus. However, we are not to remain in that spiritual condition. Unfortunately, too many now full-grown adults have settled in and have settled for that blind condition. We need to understand that we cannot continue to excuse our spiritual ignorance, especially when Jesus passes by us and takes notice of us.

Whenever Jesus passes by, it is with great intention; He sees our spiritual condition and longs to give sight to our blindness so His purposes may be fulfilled in the earth.

Paul recounts his conversion to King Agrippa. In this passage below, are the words spoken by God to Paul:

**Acts 26:16-18** “But rise and stand on your feet, for I have appeared to you for this purpose, to make you a minister and a witness both things which you have seen and of the things which I will yet reveal to you. I will deliver you from the Jewish people, as well as the Gentiles, to whom I now send you, to open their eyes, in order to turn them from darkness to light, and from the power of Satan to God, that they may receive forgiveness of sins and an inheritance among those who are sanctified by faith in Me.”

God wants our eyes opened so we can open the eyes of others! But if we do not have such an encounter with Jesus, how then can we help someone who is blind see the truth if we are also blind?

“And His disciples asked Him, saying, “Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?” (verse 2)

The disciples did not merely ask Jesus why this man was born blind, but presumed that no other reason existed for his blindness but sin. They suggested two variables as to why this man suffered from a visual impairment:

A sinful decision that he (the blind man) made, which resulted in his blindness; or a sin through his bloodline, a sin that his parents had committed.

Again, their question was asked matter-of-factly: “Who sinned, this man or his parents?” We can so easily judge a man for the same weakness that lies within us. Here, the disciples were judging his physical blindness when they were spiritually blind.

“Jesus answered, ‘Neither this man nor his parents sinned, but that the works of God should be revealed in him.’ “(verse 3)

Jesus had spiritual sight, the ability to see what was true beyond the “circumstantial evidence” presented by His own disciples. He was able to see that this man was born blind because He was willing to look beyond the man's flesh into the Spirit of God; this man's blindness would be a testimony to God. There He stood, eyes fixed into the spiritual realm, beholding the glory that was about to take place for the fame of God. Jesus knew that this man who was born blind would now see and testify to the miraculous work of Christ Jesus:

**John 9:30-33** “The man answered and said to them, “Why, this is a marvelous thing, that you do not know where He is from; yet He has opened my eyes! Now we know that God does not hear sinners, but if anyone is a worshiper of God and does His will, He hears him. Since the world began, it has been unheard of that anyone opened the eyes of one who was born blind. If this Man were not from God, He could do nothing.”

We, likewise, must have the mind of Christ to see that whatever affliction befalls us is first spiritual, stretching far beyond this cape of flesh that we wear, even though the manifestation of it is apparent in the flesh. And that is when Jesus anoints our eyes (**John 9:11**), we will see.

“...but that the works of God should be revealed in him.’ “(verse 3)

The works of God are spiritual and may manifest within us. Whenever God gets involved in delivering our souls from spiritual darkness, there is a guaranteed inward change that will take place. For who can overtake God on His throne and win? Do not all souls belong to Him? (**Ezekiel 18:4**) His Holy Spirit works behind the scenes in our hearts, often without our ever “seeing” even the slightest fingerprint left behind by His gracious hands. The inner workings of the Holy Spirit eventually become outward expressions of our faith in Christ Jesus as Lord and of our love for God.

“I must work the works of Him who sent Me while it is day; the night is coming when no one can work.” (verse 4)

Here, Jesus was referring to a spiritual darkness that would occur when He was no longer in the world. Hence, His urgency in which He moved about in the earth- Kingdom minded and never wasting one second of time. Are we equally keen on and responsive to God's Presence? His will? His way? His instructions?

We must understand that we have been sent into the world by Jesus, just as God sent Him into the world (**John 17:18**); and we must work while it is day- that is to say, while

we have life in us. The night is coming when no one can work, might well be the appointed time of death, whereby every man shall cease all his labor.

One might ask, "What work am I to do while it is day?" Read on, for the Words of our Lord that follow are key to dispelling (make disappear; drive away; scatter) darkness.

"As long as I am in the world, I am the light of the world." (verse 5)

Now again, Jesus was referring to His Presence on the earth as being the Light- the Light that can penetrate darkness. For David says,

**Psalms 139:12** "Indeed, the darkness shall not hide from You, but the night shines as the day; the darkness and the light are both alike to You."

Now, let's turn our attention to the following declaration: "As long as I am in the world." (verse 5) May I interject a question? How is Jesus in the world today? Would you agree that because we, who belong to Him, have Him living in us and we, ourselves, live in the world, He is therefore in the world?

**Matthew 5:14-16** "You are the light of the world. A city that is set on a hill cannot be hidden. Nor do they light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a lampstand, and it gives light to all who are in the house. Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven."

**1 John 4:17** "Love has been perfected among us in this: that we may have boldness in the day of judgment; because as He is, so are we in this world."

We can't cease our spiritual existence in Christ Jesus. If we do, then there would be no light in this world. Imagine for a moment if every Christian who was tired and weary from their spiritual dryness, unceasing work to be done, or the requirements of holiness commanded of their lives, were to sit down. We must take hold of the Word of God and discipline our bodies for the work that must be done:

**Romans 12:1-2** "I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that you present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God, which is your reasonable service. 2 And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God."

What if we all put our lights under a basket? What do you suppose would happen? There would be utter darkness that no human eye could pierce through or peer into. Yet many of God's soldiers, yes, even His mighty warriors, have let their lights grow dim. We mustn't forget the call of God on our lives to:

**Isaiah 60:1-3** "Arise, shine; For your light has come! And the glory of the LORD is risen upon you. For behold, the darkness shall cover the earth, and deep darkness the people; But the LORD will arise over you, and His glory will be seen upon you. The Gentiles shall come to your light, And kings to the brightness of your rising."

If we do not arise, the darkness will be consuming. We will hear of it, know of it, but if we are unwilling to do anything about it, it will overtake us. That was Eli's problem. He knew about the sins of his sons, Hophni and Phinehas. He had even heard about what they were doing, but he did not restrain them (**1 Samuel 2:22-2; 3:13**). As a result of the sins of the house of Eli, the events to follow would certainly be a dark time for Israel as they would encounter defeat and the loss of the Ark of God.

We must be determined to be effective in pushing the darkness back with the light of Christ shining in us! This means living a lifestyle of holiness. We can't afford to be in Eli's position, lying down with little to no vision. We must keep our lights ablaze with the oil of the Holy Spirit filled in our lamps!

**1 Samuel 3:2-4** "And it came to pass at that time, while Eli was lying down in his place, and when his eyes had begun to grow so dim that he could not see, 3 and before the lamp of God went out in the tabernacle of the LORD where the ark of God was, and while Samuel was lying down, 4 that the LORD called Samuel."

By God's edict, Eli would be both removed and replaced. His successor, Samuel, would become the priest to bring light to Israel.

**1 Samuel 2:35** "Then I will raise up for Myself a faithful priest who shall do according to what is in My heart and in My mind. I will build him a sure house, and he shall walk before My anointed forever."

God preserves a remnant for Himself, and Samuel was a part of God's remnant. Bible Gateway had this to say about remnant: "A remnant is a small group of people who remain faithful to God, despite widespread unbelief or faithlessness around them. God preserves a remnant to ensure a renewed and restored people in the future."

Samuel was born for the very reason of being a light in a time of darkness. In the day of Samuel as a boy ministering before Eli, "the word of the Lord was rare in those days, there was no widespread revelation." (**1 Samuel 3:1**)

And so, it is true for us; we were born to be a light in this present darkness. Jesus purposefully prayed to the Father:

**John 17:14-19** "I have given them Your word, and the world has hated them because they are not of the world, just as I am not of the world. 15 I do not pray that You should take them out of the world, but that You should keep them from the evil one. 16 They are not of the world, just as I am not of the world. 17 Sanctify them by Your truth. Your word is truth. 18 As You sent Me into the world, I also have sent them into the world. 19 And for their sakes I sanctify Myself, that they also may be sanctified by the truth."

Our call is sure in heaven, and the time is NOW on earth to answer that call! The English commentator on the Bible, Matthew Henry, put it this way: "When our Master tied us to duty, he tied us to time too." (Matthew Henry Commentary)

### Prayer Focus

- Pray for the Body of Christ to no longer be spiritually blind.
- Pray that our eyes will be open to the truth, so we can help open others' eyes.
- Pray that we will sense the coming darkness and be determined to be a light shining in the darkness.
- Pray that we will not let our light grow dim.
- Pray that we will live a lifestyle of holiness so Christ's light can shine in us.

# 52 DAYS OF PRAYER & WORSHIP



## DAY 35 – WALKING IN HIS POWER, PURITY, AND PURPOSE

**THE WORD** Hebrews 6:12; Philippians 4:7; Romans 8:28

### GLOBAL PRAYER POINT

Pray that the Church would walk confidently in God's patience, peace, power, purity, and purpose in this season.

### LIVING OUT THE WORD

Release anxiety to the Lord and walk deliberately in one area of obedience He has already revealed to you.

### DEVOTIONAL FOCUS

The Lord calls His people to walk in patience, peace, promise, power, purity, and purpose. Patience strengthens trust. Peace guards hearts. Promises anchor hope. Power equips obedience. Purity preserves testimony. Purpose directs our steps.

God's promises never fail. His power sustains what He initiates. As we surrender anxiety and striving, we walk confidently in His calling. Nothing is wasted in His plan. Trials refine, peace steadies, and purpose compels us forward in obedience.

## Day 35 - Walking in His Power, Purity, and Purpose

In my time with the Lord, this prayer was placed in my heart:

O Lord, please settle me to not be anxious, to be patient for Your perfect timing, Your perfect will. Lord, I cannot see a way for what I am feeling You are leading me to do. I need you to settle me with patience and acceptance of Your leading, Your timing. Your ways are perfect. Your power is unquenchable. Your heart is moved by our prayers, and You will do all that is necessary to bring about Your great purposes!

“Precious, I hear your words, and I am pleased. Please wait a little longer, patiently wait under the weight you are feeling. I am preparing the grounds on so many fronts, and I am preparing you. Daughter, here is My Patience. Here is My Peace. Here is My Promise. I am depositing them inside of you in greater measure than ever before. With them, now walk in My Power, walk in My Purity, and walk in My Purpose!”

As the Lord gave me this message of hope and encouragement, I studied each word to gain a greater understanding of what He was saying to you and to me.

The word patience means the ability to endure waiting, delay, or provocation without becoming annoyed or upset; to persevere calmly when faced with difficulties; and the act of waiting long for justice or an expected good without discontent.

This is a difficult word to live out, but when I see it all through the word of God, I know it is an important character trait we must all have. It is intricately linked to our trust in God!

**Hebrews 6:12** “...be imitators of those who through faith and patience inherit the promises.”

**Colossians 1:11** “(be) strengthened with all power, according to His glorious might, for the attaining of all steadfastness and patience.”

**James 1:2-4** “Consider it all joy, my brethren, when you encounter various trials, knowing that the testing of your faith produces endurance (patience). And let endurance (patience) have its perfect result, so that you may be perfect and complete, lacking in nothing.”

We must have patience to wait for the Lord’s direction and fulfilled promises; for the Lord to move, to heal...; and to remain in trials and testing with joyful hearts. We must call upon the Lord to strengthen us with His power so we can endure and wait for his perfect timing and the Lord’s perfect plans.

The word peace means tranquility; a calm and quiet state, free from disturbances or noise; a state of mental calm and serenity with no anxiety; freedom from conflict; harmony with others.

This sounds so good, and so different from what we see around us, or even in ourselves. But God, in His sovereignty and grace, wants to fill us full of His peace.

**2 John 1:3** “Grace, mercy, and peace will be with us, from God the Father and from Jesus Christ the Son of the Father, in truth and love.”

**2 Peter 1:2** “Grace and peace be multiplied to you in the knowledge of God and of Jesus Christ our Lord.”

**1 Peter 1:2** “...according to the foreknowledge of God the Father, by the sanctifying work of the Spirit, to obey Jesus Christ and be sprinkled with His blood, May grace and peace be yours in the fullest measure.”

**Philippians 4:7** “and the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding (comprehension), will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus.”

Even in whatever we are going through, we, as believers in Jesus Christ, can have peace. As this world gets darker, as the enemy gets more riled, as creation groans more for Christ’s return, and as the nations rage more against the Lord and His people, we can have peace! His peace guards our hearts and minds, so we do not have to panic or be afraid. His peace is so different from that of the world; we cannot comprehend it, but we can apprehend it!

The word promise means to assure someone that something will certainly be done or happen; to pledge to someone to provide or do something; an assurance that something will be done; an indication that something or somebody will turn out well; an indication that something is likely to happen.

**1 Kings 8:56** “Blessed be the Lord, who has given rest to his people Israel, according to all that he promised; not one word has failed of all His good promise, which He promised through Moses, his servant.”

**Luke 24:49** “And behold, I am sending forth the promise of My Father upon you; but you are to stay in the city until you are clothed with power from on high.”

**Acts 2:39** “For the promise is for you and your children and for all who are far off, as many as the Lord our God will call to Himself.”

**Romans 4:20** “yet, with respect to the promise of God, he did not waver in unbelief but grew strong in faith, giving glory to God.”

God has made many promises to us. We must take the time to diligently seek and study them in His Word, and to write down the promise He speaks to us. His promises are to assure us of His care and His plans, although we do not yet see them come to pass.

**1 Thessalonians 5:24** “Faithful is he who called you, and He also will bring it to pass.”

**Philippians 1:6** “For I am confident of this very thing that He who began a good work in you will perfect it until the day of Christ Jesus.”

God does not lie, and what He says He will do, He will do it! We put trust in His promises and rest in them!

The word power means capacity, ability, and strength to do something; control or influence over people and their actions.

**Peter 1:15** “(we) are protected by the power of God through faith, for a salvation ready to be revealed in the last times.”

**Peter 1:3** “seeing that His divine power has granted to us everything pertaining to life and godliness, through the true knowledge of Him who called us by His own glory and excellence.”

**Hebrews 1:3** “...He upholds all things by the word of His power...”

**2 Timothy 1:7** “For God has not given us a spirit of timidity, but of power and love and discipline.”

As the Lord has deposited and as He perfects His patience, peace, and promises in us, we are to now walk in His power. His power is limitless. We must know and trust the God whom we love and serve so we can boldly and confidently walk what the Lord is asking of each one of us in this season. We must know the power that is available to us in our prayers, and in our words to others in everyday speech, in the written word, and in teaching and preaching.

The word purity means absence of anything harmful, inferior, or unwanted; virtue and innocence; clarity of tone or sound.

**Titus 2:7-8** “in all things show yourselves to be an example of good deeds, with purity in doctrine, dignified, sound in speech which is beyond reproach...”

**Philippians 4:8** “Finally, brethren, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is of good repute, if there is any excellence and if anything, worthy of praise, dwell on these things.”

Purity is something we must decide to put on, and it is not easy. We have 2 enemies who are constantly battling to keep us impure: our flesh and the world. But as we get closer to the Lord and allow Him to purge us and cleanse us, we will begin to walk in purity. Please fight to be pure in mind and deeds.

The word purpose means the reason for which something exists or for which it has been made; the goal or intended outcome of something; determination (the desire or the resolve necessary to accomplish a goal).

**Job 42:2** “I know that You can do all things, and that no purpose of Yours can be thwarted.”

**Romans 8:28** “and we know that God causes all things to work together for good to those who love God, to those who are called according to His purpose.”

**Philippians 2:22** “Make my joy complete by being of the same mind, maintaining the same love, united in Spirit, intent on one purpose.”

**Colossians 1:29** “for this purpose also I labor, striving according to His purpose which works mightily within me.”

**1 Peter 4:7** “The end of all things is near; therefore, be of sound judgment and sober spirit for the purpose of prayer.”

It is important to know the Lord’s will and purposes for our lives. If not, we will just walk around in circles. God has put in mankind the desire to have purpose in our lives; what is His revealed purpose for your life?

“Sons and Daughters, when you walk in My patience, My peace, My promises, My power, My purity, and My purpose; there is nothing for you to strive to do, no need for anxiety. It is all Me!

Nothing is to burden you down. Let go of all burdens, all anxiety, all cares, and walk with Me!”

#### Prayer Focus

- Pray that we will joyfully allow God to work His patience in us through our trials and testing.
- Pray that we will allow God’s peace to guard our hearts and minds.
- Pray that we will know and walk in the promises of God for the Body of Christ and for us personally.
- Pray that we will walk in God’s power in our prayers.
- Pray that we will fight to be pure in thought, word, and deed.
- Pray that we will know God’s purposes for our lives and for this time we are living in and walk hand in hand with the Lord to accomplish His good purposes.
