

52 DAYS OF PRAYER & WORSHIP



DAY 50 – FEED MY SHEEP, SO THEY MAY BE FILLED

THE WORD John 6:26; John 21:15; Matthew 4:19

GLOBAL PRAYER POINT

Pray for hearts hungry for the Bread of Life and for believers willing to share the Word faithfully.

LIVING OUT THE WORD

Ask the Lord what “loaves” He has placed in your hands and share His Word with someone today.

DEVOTIONAL FOCUS

Jesus confronts motivations. Many seek Him for temporary provision, but He offers eternal Bread. True fulfillment comes from abiding in His Word and feeding on the truth that sustains.

When Jesus multiplied loaves and fish, He demonstrated that surrendered provision becomes abundant supply. We are called to offer what we have—our portion of the Word—and trust Him to multiply it for the hungry.

After His resurrection, Jesus challenged Peter: “Do you love Me? Feed My sheep.” Love for Christ is demonstrated through obedience and shepherding others with truth.

DAY 50 - Feed My Sheep, so They May Be Filled

John 6:26 “Jesus answered them and said, ‘Most assuredly, I say to you, you seek Me, not because you saw the signs, but because you ate of the loaves and were filled.’”

Beloved, just as Jesus instructed the crowds who followed Him about their real motivations for seeking Him, we also do not know the true motivations of our hearts. Only God knows what is really in our hearts.

Jeremiah 17:9-10 “The heart is deceitful above all things, and desperately wicked; Who can know it? I, the LORD, search the heart, I test the mind, even to give every man according to his ways, according to the fruit of his doings”.

Jesus’ twelve disciples were not following Him because of the provision of earthly bread. He gave them more than food for a day. He gave them the Bread of eternal life. When God takes hold of our hearts, we will seek Him for the true Bread and not for what we get for the moment.

We must stay focused on this one thing as we go forward in what God has called us to do on this journey. Jesus is not trying to draw His people in with signs and miracles. He knows signs and wonders are not enough to keep our hearts in covenant with Him. He wants us to know it is the Word of God, the freshly baked bread from heaven that will keep us filled.

The word filled in Greek is *chortazo*, which means to be fulfilled; to feed or fatten. On the Lord’s Day, the common people brought *chortazo* from the fields to the dinner table. The word came to signify being satisfied (content and pleased) with food in abundance. In other words, Jesus wants us to be filled with an abundance of God’s Word that brings genuine satisfaction and fulfillment (happiness) in our lives.

Matthew 15:32-34 “Now Jesus called His disciples to Himself and said, ‘I have compassion on the multitude, because they have now continued with Me three days and have nothing to eat. And I do not want to send them away hungry, lest they faint on the way.’ Then His disciples said to Him, ‘Where could we get enough bread in the wilderness to fill such a great multitude?’ Jesus said to them, ‘How many loaves do you have?’ And they said, “Seven, and a few little fish.”

Jesus is expressing His compassion for the multitude that followed Him to hear His teaching, because they had stayed to listen for three days and had nothing left to eat. He did not want to send them away weak and hungry. Jesus was always moved with compassion when he saw the state of the people. He saw they had been following Him, but they needed food that would sustain them.

Jesus knows we need to be strengthened on the journey with eternal food.

Today, I believe God sees us in the same state. He is saying, “My people are hungry; please give them food so they can continue what I am doing in their midst.” The signs

and wonders will not keep them in this season of seeking Me. They need My food to fill them up as they travel through their wilderness.

I love what His disciples said to Him.

Matthew 15:33 "Where could we get enough bread in the wilderness to fill such a great multitude?"

How do we feed them the abundance and take it to their dinner table? How can we bring fulfillment to so many people? Here is Jesus' response... Please don't look at the crowd. Surrender what little you have, and I will give it to My Father, and we will bless it, and it will be more than enough.

We must see that God wants to fill us in our wilderness (neglected, abandoned, uncultivated, position of disfavor), not with natural bread, but with Bread from Heaven. This Bread is the Lord Jesus Christ, His Word and truth that lasts forever. We must not be moved by the multitude of people; the Harvest is God's. We must start feeding them with what we have.

Jesus is asking us, He is asking you...what do you have? How much Word have I given you? Do not make excuses and say we only have this much. What you do have, He can take and multiply whatever we have to feed the multitudes stranded in the wilderness. He longs to feed the ones who are neglected, abandoned, uncultivated (land not used to produce crops), and lacking favor in their lives. Their hearts need to be cultivated so that the seed of God can take root.

That is what God called us to: to pray for those who are hungry for the truths of God's Word.

How many loaves do we have?

Are you not ONE of those LOAVES that God wants to use to get the Word to His people?

Are you not ONE of those FISH that God considers to be the fishers of men?

Matthew 4:19-20 "Then He said to them, 'Follow Me, and I will make you fishers of men.' They immediately left their nets and followed Him."

The word follow is *akoloutheo*, which means to accompany, to go along with, to go the same way with, follow one who precedes. *Akoloutheo* is being on the same road together with someone.

This word is used for soldiers, servants, and pupils; it can easily be transferred to the life of the Christian in our pursuit to walk with the Lord.

When we follow Christ to feed His people and bring them to the kingdom, there is a great reward in heaven, and our hearts are pure toward Him.

Matthew 19:27 "Then Peter answered and said to Him, 'See, we have left all and followed You. Therefore, what shall we have? "

The Lord was assuring them that when they leave all to follow Him, they will sit with Him in heaven with much honor. And everyone who has left everything for Him and His name's sake shall receive a hundredfold and inherit eternal life.

If only we could wrap our minds around that truth and promise. If we could see that life with Him is more than anything we can obtain on earth. He continues to challenge us to seek Him and not the sign. He is the eternal bread.

Please read **John 21:3-19**.

Jesus visits the disciples after His resurrection. They had gone back to fishing; they went back to their old way. But during their journey back to go fishing, they caught no fish until Jesus came on the scene.

John 21:5-6 "Then Jesus said to them, 'Children, have you any food?' They answered Him, 'No.' And He said to them, 'Cast the net on the right side of the boat, and you will find some.' So, they cast, and now they were not able to draw it in because of the multitude of fish."

Then their eyes were opened to see that it was Jesus. They were laboring for food that perishes, BUT THEY FOUND THE ONE WHO WAS THE FOOD that will not perish.

Jesus came to put them back on track, to remind them that their real purpose was to remain His disciples.

John 21:10 "Jesus said to them, 'Bring some of the fish which you have just caught."

Peter dragged the net to shore, full of large fish, yet it did not break. The Lord wants to fill our nets if we will open our eyes to see that we cannot do this without Him.

John 21:15 "So when they had eaten breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon, son of Jonah, do you love Me more than these?"

As Jesus dines with them, He challenges Peter.

He said to Him, "Yes, Lord; You know that I love You."

He said to him, "Feed My lambs."

The Lord challenged Peter three times in His love for Him to feed His lambs and sheep.

John 21:18 "Most assuredly, I say to you, when you were younger, you girded yourself and walked where you wished; but when you are old, you will stretch out your hands, and another will gird you and carry you where you do not wish." This He spoke, signifying by what death he would glorify God. And when He had spoken this, He said to him, "Follow Me."

It is time for us to grow up and move in the directions God has called us to, and that is to pray that the hearts of the people will be open to the Word.

We must not complain about what we do not know or have. What we have is enough for God to take and feed the multitude.

He will show us where the fish and loaves are located, but continue to serve Him. Let's meet Him at the dining room table and share the gospel of Christ Jesus. We must FOLLOW HIM.

Prayer Focus

- Please pray that God's people will take the Word that is in us and share it with those who do not know Jesus.
- Please pray that our insecurities will not stop us from sharing the good news of Christ's message to the lost and dying.
- Please pray for the land of the hearts of the lost to be cultivated to receive the Word of God.

52 DAYS OF PRAYER & WORSHIP



DAY 51 – ONENESS WITH HIM AND WITH ONE ANOTHER

THE WORD John 17:20–23; Ephesians 4:11–16; John 7:39

GLOBAL PRAYER POINT

Pray that the Body of Christ would walk in devotion, spiritual maturity, and true oneness with Christ and with one another.

LIVING OUT THE WORD

Examine your heart for any seed of division or distraction. Choose unity and recommit to following Christ wholeheartedly.

DEVOTIONAL FOCUS

Jesus prayed that we would be one as He and the Father are one. This oneness is not organizational unity, but spiritual union produced through the infilling of the Holy Spirit. True oneness flows from intimacy with Christ and alignment with His heart.

The Lord calls us to hear one voice—His voice. Distraction, division, and competing allegiances weaken covenant fellowship. Spiritual maturity requires devotion to Christ and trust in the leaders He appoints for growth and equipping. Leaders are given to help the Body mature into stability and love.

Oneness prepares us to carry living water to a thirsty world. As we abide in Him and walk in humility, we reflect His heart and strengthen the testimony of the Church before the nations.

DAY 51 - Devoted Partnership to Walk in Oneness with the Beloved

The word partnership means two people sharing a common cause; joining and uniting; two dancing together. When we are Beloved, we are separated and dedicated to the one we love. This one has much Love in His Heart for us!

He loves us so much. He looks for those who will become ONE with Him to produce life.

Song of **Solomon 7:7** "This stature of yours is like a palm tree, and your breasts like its clusters."

"This stature (importance/reputation/position) of yours is like a palm tree..." implies life and giving water. God has given us a position here on earth that He values and considers important. Jesus is giving us everything we need: His power, authority, and influence to touch the nations. We must be life givers to those who do not know this life.

Exodus 15:22-27

"So, Moses brought Israel from the Red Sea; then they went out into the Wilderness of Shur. And they went three days in the wilderness and found no water. Now, when they came to Marah, they could not drink the waters of Marah, for they were bitter. Therefore, the name of it was called Marah. And the people complained against Moses, saying, 'What shall we drink?' So, he cried out to the LORD, and the LORD showed him a tree. When he cast it into the waters, the waters were made sweet.

There He made a statute and an ordinance for them, and there He tested them, and said, 'If you diligently heed the voice of the LORD your God and do what is right in His sight, give ear to His commandments and keep all His statutes, I will put none of the diseases on you which I have brought on the Egyptians. For I am the LORD who heals you.'

Then they came to Elim, where there were twelve wells of water and seventy palm trees; so, they camped there by the waters."

The nations are asking for life-giving Water. God led Israel to a bitter water until they cried out to Moses, saying, "What shall we drink?" Moses cried out to the LORD, and the LORD instructed Moses on how to sweeten the water. The Water we have is sweet to the Nations; the Word of God is sweet like honey.

Psalms 119:103 "How sweet are Your Words to my taste, sweeter than honey to my mouth." As Moses cast the tree into the waters, and they were made sweet, God made a wonderful promise.

Exodus 15:26 "If you diligently heed the voice of the LORD your God and do what is right in His sight, give ear to His commandments and keep all His statutes, I will put none of the diseases on you which I have brought on the Egyptians. For I am the LORD who heals you."

I would love to speak on healing, because this is a wonderful message of a promise to keep us from the diseases of the world. The Lord, who heals, Yahweh-Rapha, is one of the compound names by which God revealed His attributes to Israel. Here, His very name declares His nature to be that of Healer to those who obey His Word.

He is also a life-giver to those who are thirsty for healing within their soul. **Exodus 15:27** shows the Israelites camped at Elim, beside ample water wells and palm trees, and He offers to us the same invitation. He desires us to camp by those palm trees for the nations and bring life from His abundance to those in need. The cry is there, but can we hear it?

He has given us what we need to bring forth healing and deliverance. He looks for us to arise and take our rightful places, just as He spoke to the Shulamite woman in Song of Solomon, "This stature of yours is like a palm tree." He wants us to camp at Elim, where the water flows abundantly, so we can fill the wells.

We must partner with Him on the journey He has called us to, so we may reach the lost in the Church and in the world. Jesus Himself went to the wilderness and found dry places, so He could bring living waters. Let's look at a couple of places where He found water, but not the living water needed for LIFE.

John 4:4-10 "But He needed to go through Samaria.

So, He came to a city of Samaria, which is called Sychar, near the plot of ground that Jacob gave to his son Joseph.

Now Jacob's well was there.

Jesus, therefore, being wearied from His journey, sat thus by the well.

It was about the sixth hour.

A woman of Samaria came to draw water.

Jesus said to her, 'Give Me a drink.' For His disciples had gone away into the city to buy food.

Then the woman of Samaria said to Him, 'How is it that You, being a Jew, ask a drink from me, a Samaritan woman?' For Jews have no dealings with Samaritans.

Jesus answered and said to her, 'If you knew the gift of God, and who it is who says to you, 'Give Me a drink,' you would have asked Him, and He would have given you living water.'"

Jesus had to go through Samaria, where Jacob's well was located. He chose that place to rest, and while He was there, a woman of Samaria said to Him, "How is it that you, being a Jew, ask a drink from me, a Samaritan woman?"

Jesus knew that to reach the lost and give living water to the thirsty, He had to step outside the Jewish comfort zone of not interacting with Samaritans or women. He requires the same of us; that we forego what is familiar and acceptable to us and to others.

Jesus was carrying the living water that she needed; He did not need what she had to give. He was the ONE who carried the living water for eternity, and likewise, the world today does not need water that fills our thirst for a moment but living water that fills us for a lifetime.

John 7:37-38 “On the last day, that great day of the feast, Jesus stood and cried out, saying, 'If anyone thirsts, let him come to Me and drink. He who believes in Me, as the Scripture has said, out of his heart will flow rivers of living water.'”

When we are ONE with God, our hearts will flow with rivers of living water. In **John 7:39**, He made it clear that the ONENESS we seek comes through the infilling of the Holy Spirit. The Lord wants us to carry this life-giving water of the Holy Spirit, so that eternal life and fruit for the Kingdom are produced.

John 5:4 “For an angel went down at a certain time into the pool and stirred up the water; then whoever stepped in first, after the stirring of the water, was made well of whatever disease he had.”

When Jesus shows up, He does not have to stir the water. He carries it in Himself.

John 5:7-8 “The sick man answered Him, 'Sir, I have no man to put me into the pool when the water is stirred up; but while I am coming, another steps down before me.' Jesus said to him, 'Rise, take up your bed and walk.' And immediately the man was made well, took up his bed, and walked.”

Are we walking in Oneness with Him, allowing the world to see us bearing the living water He desires us to carry, the water that produces eternal life? We must take this water to those who are thirsty.

Let's look at the Shulamite's response to her love.

Songs of **Solomon 7:10-12** “I am my beloved's, and his desire is toward me. Come, my beloved, let us go forth to the field; let us lodge in the villages. Let us get up early to the vineyards; let us see if the vine has budded, whether the grape blossoms are open, and the pomegranates are in bloom. There, I will give you my love.”

This is true intimacy of Love for the Beloved (Jesus). She recognizes her beloved's desire toward her, and in response, her desire is now for Him. Look at her heart as it says, 'Come, my beloved.' She wants to please Him, so she shows Him all that she does because she knows His HEART. She takes Him on a journey of what she has done.

First, 'Let us go forth to the field': She invites Him to come and see the Harvest, it is ready, and she wants Him to see what the BRIDE has prepared for Him.

Second, 'Let us lodge in the villages': She takes Him to see the ones who cannot defend themselves. She is telling Him that she has done justice in the villages, in places where orphans, widows, and the poor need His love.

Third, 'Let us get up early to the vineyards': Her next destination is the Church, the body of Christ. She says, "Come and see Your vineyard, Your Church, and how the Holy Spirit has given me what I need to prepare Your Bride."

And 'Let us see if the vine has budded': She takes Him to observe the growth of the vine, the leaves and flowers that represent the new growth. These are the Leaders of His church whom He establishes, those who are chosen and mature, to lead His Army.

She laid all this up for HIM; so, she may please Him through their intimacy!!

Where are we, Church? Are we ready to stir up the love of God and awaken it? Are we ready to please Him in this next place He is taking us?

Arise Church. Our Beloved is calling us.

Prayer Focus

- Please pray that we will partner with Jesus' heart to share His love with all people.
- Please pray that we will position ourselves beside the sweet waters of His Word so we can impart this life-giving water to others.

DAY 52 – LET'S FIX OUR EYES ON HIM AS WE MOVE INTO OUR NEXT DIRECTION

THE WORD 2 Corinthians 8:21; 2 Chronicles 7:14–15; Isaiah 64:4

GLOBAL PRAYER POINT

Pray for perseverance beyond this season—that prayer and worship would continue consistently in homes, churches, and communities.

LIVING OUT THE WORD

Commit to a sustained rhythm of prayer. Fix your eyes on Christ daily and ask Him to direct your next steps.

DEVOTIONAL FOCUS

The 52 days of prayer and worship conclude, but the journey of prayer has only begun. We must carry forward what the Lord has built—walking in integrity, holiness, and continued dependence upon His voice.

God has prepared what eye has not seen and ear has not heard. Yet those prepared things are revealed only to those who humble themselves, seek His face, and pray. Our next direction must be marked by honor before God and before men.

We cannot cease because a fast has ended. We must continue to gather, to intercede, to worship, and to cry out for revival in our families, churches, and communities. The Lord who fought for Jehoshaphat remains the same today. Deep calls unto deep. Fix your eyes on Him. Wait upon Him. Listen for His voice as you move forward.



DAY 52 - Let's Fix our Eyes on Him as We Move Into our Next

Direction

2 Corinthians 8:21 "...providing honorable things, not only in the sight of the Lord, but also in the sight of men."

With the directions that God has given us for our next journey, we must carry out His instructions in an honorable way before God and before men. We must walk in integrity and holiness, pleasing God, as we represent Him in all we do.

We must see that God has plans for us, and we must be in His presence continually to hear His voice. Our Pastor Duncan, my husband, has instructed us to continue to pray. This is the kind of godly leader I want to follow: a minister of God's word who honors God in his daily walk. As I watch him make godly commitments before men, I can follow and imitate my pastor as he follows Christ.

The journey of prayer has just begun. We need to arise with prayer and worship as we cry out to God. King Jehoshaphat led the people to believe in God. The LORD is the same yesterday and today, and He will fight our battles.

2 Chronicles 7:14-15 "If My people who are called by My name will humble themselves, and pray and seek My face, and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin and heal their land. Now my eyes will be open and My ears attentive to prayer made in this place."

We must believe Jesus has so much more for us as we humble ourselves, seek His Face, and pray!

1 Corinthians 2:9-10 "Eye has not seen, nor ear heard, nor have entered the heart of man the things which God has prepared (made ready for us) for those who love Him. But God has revealed them to us through His Spirit. For the Spirit searches all things, yes, and the deep things of God.

What is God saying to us? We do not know all that He has prepared for us in this season; therefore, we absolutely must spend time with Him to know all He has for us.

The word prepare means to make ready, prepare, and plan. Our Lord Jesus has prepared and made things ready for us to move forward, but we must seek His face. The Holy Spirit must search the depths of our hearts, as He reveals the depth of God's heart.

Psalms 42:1 "As the deer pants for the water brooks, so pants my soul for You, O God."

Our soul (mind, will, emotions) must long for Him as He calls us to the deeper places.

Psalms 42:7 "Deep calls unto deep at the noise of Your waterfalls; all Your waves and billows have gone over me."

Are we hearing the call of going deeper? Can we fix (fasten securely to a place) our hearts toward His direction and path as He calls?

Do we stop the intense prayer now that the study is over?

Are we going to open our eyes and ears to hear and see God?

Isaiah 64:4 "For since the beginning of the world men have not heard nor perceived by the ear, nor has the eye seen any God besides You, who acts for the one who waits for Him."

We must hear and see as we wait on Him. Listen for God speaking to you about PRAYER.

Prayer Focus

- We must continue to gather with one another and pray in our families, churches, and communities. We must have consistent prayers going up before the Lord.
- Please pray how and when you will continue in individual and corporate prayer.
- Thank you for your faithfulness to God in building the wall of Prayer and Worship these last 52 days; now let's get on the wall and pray! As the Body of Christ, we are looking forward to seeing you at the altar of prayer and worship.
